Excerpt from Independence of Cuba: Remarks in the Senate April 18, 1898 As a treaty is a compact between independent nations, whenever it is proposed to enter into a treaty the question necessarily arises as to whether the party proposing to become bound by it is an independent nation. The President, therefore, before he enters into the consideration of the subject-matter of a treaty necessarily must make inquiries as to whether the other party is a national sovereignty and has an independent existence. So, whenever such question is presented to the President as incidental to the exercise of the treaty-making power, the President must determine that question of national independence, which involves the competency of the party proposing to enter into the contract; but when he has decided that question and enters into the treaty, it must be submitted to the Senate for its concurrence, as provided in the Constitution. The Senate of the United States must necessarily pass in review all the elements which are primarily to be considered by the Executive whenever the making of...
