Knowing that multivariate analysis of variance and covariance are often used to test for differences among two, three or more means without increasing the risk of Type I errors, the aim of this analysis was to compare the ability to perform different reading and writing activities that are related to the students' use of memory, senses, and observation. The database used provided the results of a survey of 303 students on their reading and writing abilities. The overall research question was as follows: In which of the three ability groups (i.e., low, medium, or high) did college students have the highest reading and/or writing abilities In Chapter I of this paper, the study design and descriptive statistics are reviewed.
